Houston Community Forum February 1, 2023

29 parents, staff, and students in attendance

The following questions, comments, and concerns were shared at the Houston Community Forum regarding declining enrollment. Answers are provided where possible and all comments are included to ensure all participants input is taken into consideration.

Transportation

Question: If Houston Middle School students will be catching the bus, will

they be riding the bus with high school students?

Answer: This is highly unlikely due to the different starting times for

elementary, middle, and high schools.

Question: Will the elementary and high school students be on the same bus?

Answer: Same answer as question above.

Question: Will there be another bus available and will there be drivers due to

the shortage?

Answer: Our bus driver shortage complicates planning transportation

routes.

Question: How will the difference in start times for High, Middle and

Elementary Schools be accounted for in the transportation plan?

Answer: Our transportation department will evaluate start times for all

impacted schools and will develop bus routes based on this

analysis.

Safety

Statement: A parent shared concerns about gang activity at Millswood

Middle School.

Statement: A parent had safety concerns about her child attending a

school in town. She is scared her daughter will be beat up in

the restroom.

Statement: A parent expressed additional safety concerns about students

attending Millswood Middle School. There are students who are threatening to commit suicide at the other Lodi middle schools.

Facilities

Question: With so many students going to Victor, is the district going to be

adding portables to the site?

Answer: Should the Board later consider combining Victor and Houston,

Business Services would work to address any facility issues for

adequate classroom space.

Question: Will the infrastructure meet the needs of our students in 6 months

at Victor Elementary?

Answer: The likelihood of any changes for Houston K-6 would not occur unil

2024-2025, which is ample time to address space issues.

Intra-district Agreements (IDA)

Question: If our numbers at Houston are dwindling, why is the principal

approving IDAs for the student to attend other schools? Principal

should be denying IDAs to keep students here.

Answer: IDAs are generally denied when there is no room at the site

requested not to maintain enrollment at the home site.

Question: Are we going to approve IDAs for the 2023-24 school year for

parents who want their child to attend Houston in 2023-24?

Answer: Staffing is based on projected enrollment. IDAs are only approved

on a year to year basis at elementary schools.

Question: With the IDAs submitted to attend Houston next year, are they

going to be approved or will they be denied?

Answer: Same answer as question above.

Funding

Statement: It's going to cost a lot of money to revamp Victor. Instead of

revamping Victor, let's invest the money in Houston.

Question: How much money would we save by closing Houston School? We

want the numbers regarding how much money we have

saved.

Answer: It depends. Many of the existing expenditures will be shifted to

different Lodi USD sites. There will be overall cost savings.

Question: Where is the money coming from to fund the plan that was

presented to expand Victor School as opposed to funding Houston

and making a better school life for students?

Answer:

The money will come from district Capital Fund 40. What is initially planned is adding a lunch shelter and make some Americans With Disabilities (ADA) improvements. Rather than fix existing bathrooms, we will be adding a restroom portable. We are also adding portable classrooms as needed to accommodate increased enrollment at Victor. There is currently not enough room at Victor to eat lunch. This is the reason we would add the lunch shelter. The restroom portable is required as part of the construction project for lunch shelter. This is an ADA requirement. The Acampo Road site has had several million dollars in modernization projects over the last several years unrelated to potential future changes

Staffing / Enrollment

Statement: Our teachers are amazing. We want to keep our fantastic teachers

at Houston Elementary.

Question: Why are students denied placement at their home school

Houston?

Answer: Schools are staffed based on projected enrollment. Classrooms

are staffed at 24 to 1 K-3, and 30 to 1 4-6. When class sizes

exceed staffing ratios, students are overflowed to existing space.

Question: Why is the principal's time split between 2 schools, with most of the

principal's time spent at Victor, leaving teachers in charge?

Answer: The principal is split because of the small size of both sites.

Question: Where would our teachers go? What happens to the teachers who

have been working so hard at Houston?

Answer: Teachers will be able to participate in the contracted transfer

process and may apply for vacant teaching positions which

could include Victor School.

Question: How will the numbers of students at Houston increase when the

combo classes are full and why can we not add another

teacher/class to accommodate students that live within the feeder

area?

Answer: Combo classes are only created when enrollment is low.

Question: Why is the first plan/solution to shut down Houston?

Answer: Houston has continued to experience declining enrollment for

many years. As a school site becomes smaller, the options

become limited for students.

Question: There is a full six grade class at Victor in addition to the 10 at

Houston for a total of 42 seventh grade students for next year.

Why can't we keep middle school?

Answer: Not all Victor 6th graders attend Houston School. Considering

the challenges of staffing middle school with elementary teachers

is one that currently exists at Houston School.

Afterschool Program

Question: I have a first grade student enrolled in Bridge. Will she be

able to attend the Bridge program at Victor Elementary

School?

Answer: Yes

General Concerns

Statement: A parent expressed concerns about closing down the school.

She expressed pursuing legal options if Houston School is

closed.

Statement: We should be advertising to bring more parents over to Houston

School.

Statement: A parent expressed that middle school staff at Houston have

developed strong connections with students. Middle School

students are a family at Victor.

Statement: A parent expressed concerns about an attendance area student

who was overflowed to Woodbridge School. We need to keep our

students here.

Statement: Parents expressed concerns that this happened approximately 5

years ago and was presented as a plan prior to getting community

input and the community was assured Houston would be

maintained.

Statement: Parents express agreement that they would like to remain at

Houston.

Statement: Please add early in the Board agenda on February 7.

Statement: Please have the answers to the questions from parents by the next

board meeting

Statement: Please note the numbers at the middle school are 65 and not 40

students.

Question: Has the district run the numbers on property values in an area

when a school is shut down?

Answer: The district has a fiduciary responsibility, but doesn't weigh in on

property value studies.

Question: Have they considered bringing students from Lockeford K-8 School

to increase enrollment at the Middle School Level in Houston? There aren't any extra students there, it is also low enrollment.

Answer: No. Enrollment at Lockeford includes 460 students in K-8.

Question: How long has the district really been planning this? Are we ready

to transfer middle school students to Millswood Middle School?

Answer: Enrollment is reviewed each year. Adding a small number of

students would not have a significant impact on the program at

Millswood. Any staffing increases would be provided.

Question: Where is our representative? Where is our elected representative

who we elected to the School Board?

Answer: Principal Alberto Velarde, Area 2 Director Peter Lambert, and

Director of Education Rafael Ceja attended meeting to share plans

regarding declining enrollment and collect input from Houston School community. The Board of Education will be provided this

information.

Question: Where are the alternative plans to keep Houston open?

Answer: The ongoing declining enrollment trends would not make keeping

Houston School is cost prohibitive.

Question: Why were parents not given earlier notice? A parent expressed

concerns about the short notice for tonight's meeting. As a working parent, we would appreciate more time to adjust our

schedules.

Answer: We appreciate your input and will make every effort to provide

future notices one week in advance.

Question: What time is the Board meeting on February 7?

Answer: Staff shared the Board Meeting starts at 7:00 pm on Tuesday,

February 7, 2023.

Question: How will the new housing developments affect the enrollment

Answer: New housing near Walmart and Costco in Lodi is yielding very few

students.
