Plans for Spending

What are the proposed expenditures for materials and supplies?

Expenditures to include additional equipment for after-school clubs that will operate out of campus classrooms and the campus STEAM Lab. Targeted activities and clubs include after-school performing arts clubs/groups, photography/video, computer coding, music performance and composition clubs, as well as "maker" clubs (utilizing art materials and the site's 3D printer). We will also seek resources outside to provide supplemental instruction.

What are the proposed expenditures for staffing and what are the focus areas (e.g. art, music, theater, STEAM, etc....)?

Expenditures to include time cards for certificated and classified staff members to support clubs and activities. These expenditures are also inclusive of funds needed for hiring educational partnership programs and organizations to support STEAM clubs and activities.
