

**LODI UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT
PUBLIC HEARING NOTICE
PROPOSED DEDICATION OF RIGHT-OF-WAY
AND PUBLIC UTILITY EASEMENT
TO CITY OF LODI**

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that, pursuant to California Education Code section 17556 et seq., the Board of Education ("Board") of Lodi Unified School District ("District") has adopted a Resolution of Intent to Dedicate a Right-of-Way and Public Utility Easement to the City of Lodi ("City") for public roadway purposes and to construct, maintain, repair, replace, remove and operate lines for public utilities, both publicly and privately owned, together with the right to enter upon the Property to the extent that such entry may be necessary for the constructing, maintaining, repairing, replacing, removing and operating said access, lines or appurtenances thereto ("Right-of-Way and Public Utility Easement"). The Right-of-Way and Public Utility Easement is proposed to be located on a portion of the District's property located at West Vine Street, Lodi, CA 95240. A public hearing will be held during the regular meeting of the Board on **July 13, 2021, at 7:00 p.m.**, or as soon thereafter as practicable, in the District's James Areida Education Support Center, located at 1305 East Vine Street, Lodi, CA 95240, on the question of the District conveying the Right-of-Way and Public Utility Easement to the City. The date of the public hearing may be changed in the discretion of the District by giving notice thereof.

Any interested person may be heard on the matter of the District conveying the Right-of-Way and Public Utility Easement by submitting written comments online at <https://lodipublic.ic-board.com/>. Online comments must be submitted after 5:30 p.m. on July 13, 2021. If no legal protest is entered, the Board may at that same meeting or a meeting scheduled within sixty (60) days thereafter adopt a resolution by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of its Board members authorizing and directing the execution of an Right-of-Way and Public Utility Easement conveyance document for the District to convey the Right-of-Way and Public Utility Easement to City.
