- 7.4% increase in EL reclassification
- 1.5% increase in students meeting standard or above on the SBAC Math
- 3 points closer to standard in Math
- 6.95% increase in 11th graders earning standard met or above on the SBAC ELA
- 4.05% improvement in attendance
- 8.6% improvement in chronic absenteeism
- Attendance for all designated subgroups shows growth
- Foster youth and students with disabilities showed growth in ELA
- African American/Black students, foster youth and students with disabilities showed growth in math and a reduction in suspension rate
- High school graduation rates improved for foster youth and students with disabilities

Goal 1 Metrics

- 15 Metrics in goal 1
- 8 metrics do not have an update available
- 3 metrics show growth based on the prior metric data
 - 0.5% increase in A-G completion
 - 7.4% increase in EL reclassification
 - 0.9% increase in percentage of pupils passing 2 or more AP exams
- 4 metrics demonstrate a slight decline
 - 0.8% decrease in percentage of students completing a CTE pathway
 - 0.8% decrease in percentage of pupils completing CTE & A-G
 - 0.2% decrease in EL progress through ELPAC
 - 0.8% decrease in pupils receiving the State Seal of Biliteracy



Goal 1 Actions

- 18 actions are being partially implemented
- 5 actions have already contributed to increased mid-year outcome data
- 29% of all funds expensed as of 11/30/23 (higher percent pending)
- ESSER III and Learning Recovery Block Grant funds are partially funding several actions



All students including targeted students will demonstrate proficiency in literacy, mathematics, and technology to prepare students to be college and career ready.



Goal 2 Metrics

3 metrics in goal 2

All 3 metrics show growth or maintained based on the prior metric data

- 1.5% increase in students meeting standard or above on the SBAC Math
- 1 point closer to standard in ELA
- 3 points closer to standard in Math
- 6.95% increase in 11th graders earning standard met or above on the SBAC ELA
- 0.46% increase in 11th graders earning standard met or above on the SBAC Math



Goal 2 Actions

- 4 actions are being partially or fully implemented
- All actions have contributed to increased mid-year outcome data
- 42% of all funds expensed as of 11/30/23 (higher percent pending)
- ESSER III and Learning Recovery Block Grant funds are partially funding all actions

Goal 3 Metrics

9 metrics in goal 3

2 metrics do not have an update available

5 metrics show growth or maintained based on the prior metric data

- 0.98% improvement in middle school drop out rate
- 4.05% improvement in attendance
- 8.6% improvement in chronic absenteeism
- 0.11% improvement in high school dropout rate
- The expulsion rate remained the same

2 metrics demonstrate a slight decline

- 0.3% increase in suspension rate
- 2.1% decrease in the high school graduation rate



Goal 3 Actions

- 6 actions are being partially implemented
- 2 actions have contributed to increased mid-year outcome data
- 35/42 bilingual community liaison positions are filled
- All CWA community liaison positions are filled
- 30% of all funds expensed as of 11/30/23 (higher percent pending)
- ESSER III and Learning Recovery Block Grant funds are partially funding some actions



Increase access to school by decreasing chronic absentee and suspension rates. By increasing educational access to Students Experiencing Homelessness, Black/African American students, foster youth, and students with disabilities, greater student achievement will follow, with a corresponding higher graduation rate for Foster Youth and Students with Disabilities.

7 metrics in goal 4

3.5 metrics do not have an update available

Metrics showing growth or maintained based on the prior metric data
Attendance for all subgroups shows growth

- Foster youth and students with disabilities showed growth in ELA
- African American/Black students, foster youth and students with disabilities showed growth in math
- High school graduation rates improved for foster youth and students with disabilities
- Suspension rates improved for African American/Black students, foster youth and students with disabilities

Metrics demonstrating a slight decline

- African American/Black students and homeless students showed a decline in ELA
- Homeless students showed a decline in math and increase in suspension rate

- 4 actions are being partially implemented
- 2 actions are planned and implementation is beginning
- All CWA community liaison positions are filled
- BCBAs are in place
- 15% of all funds expensed as of 11/30/23 (higher percent pending)
- ESSER III and Learning Recovery Block Grant funds are partially funding some actions
