# <u>Timeline Impacting School Actions During COVID-19</u>

## February 14, 2020

California Department of Education (CDE) released Guidance for Schools.

## March 4, 2020

Governor Newsom proclaimed a State of Emergency in California due to COVID-19.

## March 7, 2020

California Department of Public Health (CDPH) released Guidance for Schools.

### March 13, 2020

San Joaquin County officials' recommendation to close schools for in-person instruction.

### March 18, 2020

CDE released Distance Learning Consideration.

## March 19, 2020

Governor Newsom issued Stay at Home Order.

#### March 20, 2020

Governor Newsom issued Executive Order to close broad spectrum of industries and services including in-person instruction at schools.

## March 20, 2020

CDE released Guidance for Special Education.

## March 25, 2020

San Joaquin County officials recommended extended closures of schools for in-person instruction.

## April 2, 2020

San Joaquin County recommended to extend Distance Learning for remainder of the 2019-2020 school year.

## May 4, 2020

Governor Newsom announced California was prepared to start reopening the state economy effective May 8, 2020. Schools were preparing to provide in-person instruction for the start of the 2020-2021 school year.

## June 5, 2020

CDPH released revised Guidance for Schools.

#### June 8, 2020

CDE released Guidance for Schools.

#### June 17, 2020

San Joaquin County released Guidance for Schools.

#### July 13, 2020

San Joaquin County officials recommended schools start new school year with 100% Distance Learning.

## July 14, 2020

San Joaquin County officials released updated Guidance for Schools.

## July 17, 2020

Governor Newsom issued new plan with CDPH including a system of monitoring COVID-19 and new restrictions on in-person instruction. San Joaquin County was on the state monitoring list and was prohibited from providing in-person instruction.

## July 17, 2020

CDPH released Reopening Framework for Schools.

## July 24, 2020

San Joaquin County official released updated Guidance for Schools.

## July 29, 2020

San Joaquin County officials issued public health order for schools to remain on all Distance Learning until county was moved from monitoring list.

## August 3, 2020

CDPH released new Guidance for Schools and information on waivers for elementary schools.

## August 7, 2020

San Joaquin County officials released updated Guidance for Schools.

## August 25, 2020

CDPH released Guidance for Schools related to cohorts for targeted student groups.

## August 28, 2020

Governor Newsom announced the *Blueprint for a Safer Economy*, which identified a colored tier system for reopening. San Joaquin County was added from the county monitoring list to the most restrictive tier (purple tier).

## August 31, 2020

San Joaquin County Public Health Services (PHS) updated the Stay at Home Order in order to adopt and implement the state blueprint. In-person instruction was prohibited while county was in the purple tier. The waiver for elementary grades would be granted when county case rate was at/below 14 per 100k per day.

## September 4, 2020

CDPH released updated Guidance to Schools regarding Cohorts.

## **September 29, 2020**

San Joaquin County was moved to the red tier (substantial).

#### **September 16, 2020**

San Joaquin County officials released updated Guidance for Schools.

#### October 6, 2020

The Health Equity Metric was added to the tier system.

#### October 13, 2020

San Joaquin County officials released updated Guidance for Schools.

## November 16, 2020

Changes were made to the tier system.

#### November 16, 2020

San Joaquin County moved back to the purple tier (widespread). Lodi USD was not able to move forward with resuming in-person instruction.

## November 21, 2020

CDPH issued Limited Stay at Home Order.

## December 2, 2020

San Joaquin County officials issued updated Guidance for Schools.

## December 3, 2020

CDPH issued Regional Stay at Home Order based on ICU availability.

## December 20, 2020

Governor Newsom pledged to advance the California Safe Schools for All Plan.

#### **December 22, 2020**

CDPH issued supplement to Stay at Home Order.

#### December 30, 2020

CDPH released summary of Safe Schools for All Plan.

#### January 1, 2021

Assembly Bill (AB) 685 went into effect, which requires the District to notify all employees at a work site of potential exposures, COVID-19-related benefits and protections, and disinfection and safety measures that will be taken at the work site in response to a confirmed case.

## January 8, 2021

Governor Newsom announced In-Person Instruction Grants.

## January 14, 2021

CDPH released updated Guidance for Schools.

#### January 15, 2021

Regional Stay at Home Order lifted.

## January 25 and 27, 2021

Governor Newsom announced vaccination efforts.

## February 9, 2021

CDPH released Health Equity Playbook.

#### February 12, 2021

Governor Newsom launched the *Safe Schools for All Plan* Interactive Safe Schools Reopening Plan.

## February 19, 2021

CDPH released updated Guidance for Youth Sports.

#### February 22, 2021

CDPH released updated Guidance for Schools.

#### March 1, 2021

Governor Newsom and legislative leaders announced \$6.6 billion budget package to reopen schools.

## March 4, 2021

CDPH released updated Guidance for Sports.

## March 4, 2021

Vaccination metric added to the tier system.

# March 5, 2021

Governor Newsom signed AB 86, a budget bill containing provisions to help reopen schools, into law. AB 86 went into effect immediately.

# March 9, 2021

CDPH released additional information for the *Blueprint for a Safety Economy*.
