Tuesday, January 10 Special Board Meeting	Board approves process to provisionally appoint a Board Member for Trustee Area 6. A Board Ad Hoc Subcommittee consisting of less than a quorum of the Board shall be appointed.
Wednesday, January 11	District will make public the application process using <i>Lodi News-Sentinel,</i> <i>Stockton Record</i> , social media, mass notifications, and information to school sites within the boundaries of Area 6.
Wednesday, January 11 to Wednesday, February 8	A letter of interest along with a resume will be accepted by mail or in person addressed to: Board of Education Lodi Unified School District 1305 E. Vine Street, Lodi, CA 95240-3148 Deadline to apply: 12:00 p.m. Wednesday, February 8, 2023
Wednesday, February 15	Board Ad Hoc Subcommittee meets to ensure that applicants are eligible for Board membership and announce the names of the eligible candidates.
Thursday, February 23 Special Board Meeting	Public Board Meeting for Board to interview candidates and approve a provisional appointment.
Thursday, February 24	Notice of provisional appointment published in local newspapers and posted in at least three (3) public places within the district.
Friday, March 24	Deadline for a petition to be filed by registered voters within Lodi USD boundaries with the office of the County Superintendent of Schools calling for a special election, pursuant to California Education Code 5091.
Tuesday, March 28 Regular Board Meeting	If no successful petition is submitted, appointee takes Oath of Office.

- Applicants must be a registered voter and reside within the boundaries of Lodi USD Trustee Area 6 to be eligible for consideration.
- The appointed person shall hold office until the next regularly scheduled election for District Governing Board Members (November 2024).
